Village of Yigo. Take RT1 (Marine Corps Drive) to Yigo. Group is immediately north of RT29 (Gayinero Rd). Catholic Church is on the east side of RT1. Group meets on the second floor of a multi-function building across the parking lot of the Church.

911 Marine Corps Drive (RT1), Upper Tumon, running parallel to Hotel Row in Tumon. Parish Hall is located to the right side of St. John's Church. (St. John's School is to the left of the Church)

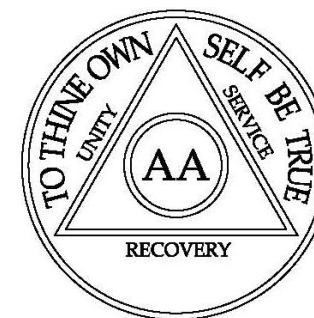
