24 Trained for Youth Crisis Helpline



The Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse (DMHSA), Prevention & Training Branch hosted a 'Train the Trainer' workshop for Guam's Youth Crisis Helpline volunteers. Elizabeth Makulec, Executive Director of the Kids Under Twenty One (KUTO) program trained youth between the ages of 15-24 years old, as well as **DMHSA Prevention & Training Branch** staff on February 19th - 21st. The training was held at the Guam Marriott Resort & Spa, Lobby Conference Room in Tumon. A

total of 24 participants completed a twenty-hour (20) training to prepare them to respond effectively to crisis calls. Topics included values clarification, active listening, stress and depression, caller management, suicide and grief. Volunteers have committed to working at least four hours a week when the Youth Crisis Helpline component of DMHSA's Crisis Hotline (647-8833) is implemented. KUTO has committed to help Guam build its capacity for strengthening telephone hotline procedures, increasing youth crisis worker recruitment and training, as well as coaching and supporting youth crisis workers. KUTO was founded in 1987 in St. Louis, MO. and trains youth with the skills, confidence and courage to help a friend or peer by implementing the 'teens helping teens help themselves' philosophy.




SUBGRANTEE UPDATES





Sanctuary, Incorporated of Guam created educational and awareness brochures and factsheets in three different languages: English, Chamorro, and Chuukese focused on four specific topics generated during focus group meetings. Brochure topics include: "We Are No Different"—Suicide warning signs, and how to help someone suicidal. "You Are Not Alone...Finding Strength and Courage to Live" —surviving suicide: how to cope with suicide. Factsheet topics included "Facts for Youth"—Communication Skills and Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender—GLBT Community and suicide. The Youth Crisis Helpline will be manned by youth volunteers trained in crisis intervention beginning mid March. The Youth Helpline will run from 6:00pm to 10:00pm on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. In addition to launching the Youth Helpline, Youth for Youth Live! Guam has been planning their 20th Annual conference scheduled for April 30, May 1, and 2, 2010. The theme for the conference is HYPE (Helping Young People Empower). Each day will focus on a specific theme: Underage drinking prevention, Suicide prevention and Substance abuse prevention. 
